On February 15th, The Red Lake County Central Riverwatch hosted an awareness event at a girls basketball game. As a members of the group, we set up a booth to show what we do and how we do things when we have, what we call sample days.

We also had a series of questions about our rivers, their resources and about river watch. With that we had a little game where you grab a duck and match the question to the number on the duck that was drawn. When a person got the answer right, they received a treat or a prize.

The event was a lot of fun, we had a slideshow with our area's rivers and their resources. We have learned a lot about what a watershed is, how it works, how it can be affected. We are part of the Red Riv-

er watershed basin. The Red River basin is about 40,200 square miles. It goes through two different states. It is a drainage basin area for the Red River.

What is a drainage basin, it is any area of land where precipitation collects and drains off into a common outlet. The Riverwatch program is a great way to bring the classroom out into the real world and see real life applications. And to understand why we do the things we do, why we record our data, look at PH, dissolved oxygen, turbidity, water clarity, and heights of our rivers. Through time we can see changes which can be good or bad, but through those things we can make adjustments and learn more and hopefully make good decisions in regard to the health of our streams and rivers. We all play a part of the team!

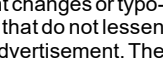

Salmon Patties
James & Stacy (Lambert) Rathke

- 3/4 - 1 lb fresh salmon
 1 egg white
 1 stalk celery, chopped
 1 small onion, chopped
 2 Tbsp fresh parsley, chopped fine
 Old Bay Seasoning
 salt and pepper to taste
 Tabasco to taste
 1 lemon



Filet and cut the filet into quarters, removing all of the brown meat in the middle. Poach the salmon for 8 - 10 minutes. Place in a bowl and flake the fish coarsely. Whip the egg white until frothy and add the celery, onion, and parsley. Add in the Old Bay, Tabasco, salt and pepper and the juice of 1/2 of the lemon. Add in the salmon. In a medium/high heated skillet add a tsp of olive oil. Form the salmon into a ball with a large spoon and place in the skillet. Pat down gently, forming a patty. Fry for 4 - 6 minutes per side. Serve with a lemon wedge and a sprig of fresh parsley.

NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAXES

STATE OF MINNESOTA ~ COUNTY OF RED LAKE

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST

A list of real property in Red Lake County on which delinquent property taxes and penalties are due has been filed with the District Court Administrator of Red Lake County. This list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture

because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer or other interested person must either pay the tax and penalty, plus costs or file a written objection with the District Court Administrator. The objection must be filed by April 19, 2022, stating the reason why the property tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgment will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest, and costs.

For property under court

judgment, the period of redemption begins on May 9, 2022. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture. The period of redemption is three years, with a handful of exemptions. The redemption period is one year for most properties located in a targeted neighborhood, as defined in the Minnesota laws, and for municipal solid waste disposal facilities. The redemption period is five-weeks

for certain abandoned or vacant properties.

You may also enter into a confession of judgment as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments with a down payment due at the time you confess judgment. The length of the installment plan varies: 5 years for commercial-industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties. If you have homesteaded

property, you may be eligible for a Senior Citizen's Property Tax Deferral, which enables seniors to pay just 3% of their household income and allow remaining amounts to become a lien on the property that may be deferred for later payment (perhaps upon eventual sale of the property).

It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you owe delinquent tax.

To determine how much interest and costs must be

Crime thriller set in Black Hawk County, Iowa

What do big agriculture and a series of grisly murders have in common?

That answer to that lies in Erin Young's debut crime novel, The Fields, set in Black Hawk County, Iowa.

At the heart of the novel is Riley Fisher, detective sergeant with the Black Hawk County Sheriff's Office. Inspired by her grandfather, a legendary lawman, Riley faces personal challenges when charged with solving the murder of her childhood friend, Chloe Miller. When Miller is found facedown in a lonely cornfield, Fisher senses some vague connection to big ag that eventually leads to the governor's office.

"Riley thought back to John Brown's complaints against Agri-Co. Too powerful to challenge. Too big to fail. It was true that the bigger these companies became the more they were able to pull into their orbit – land and research grants, government subsidies and political support. But those weren't the only things these giants sucked up. Across the country, whole communities were being left as ghost towns

as local firms and families, unable to complete, were forced to close down. The lifeblood of rural America was being drained, leaving husks of cities, where poverty and crime rushed in to fill the void. It was a legacy all too visible in the boarded-up factories and processing plants that loomed like broken tombs around the city, haunted by vagrants and

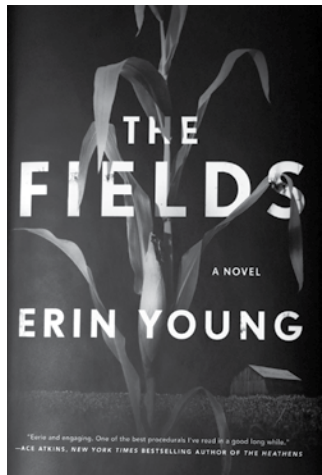
hookers, and cruised nightly by the squad cars of Waterloo PD."

Finding some connection between big ag and Miller's murder is not the only challenge Fisher faces. As she tries to solve Chloe's murder and the later disappearance of Gracie Foster, she comes to terms with her own past.

"It dawned on Riley what the gnawing inside her was. It wasn't revulsion or pity. It was recognition. A knowing, deep down, that if she hadn't had a family determined to find her, this could have been her. She thought of Gracie Foster, out there somewhere – a lost girl in a violent world. Thought of Chloe in the suffocating dark of those cornfields."

Compounding Fisher's problems is keeping an eye on her niece Maddie whose father, Fisher's brother, is arrested on a drug charge. She finds herself suspended from the department as the tension builds.

Young skillfully weaves together high-stakes intrigue, a chain of apparent murders and Miller's past to an explosive conclusion. This is crime fiction at its best.
