In 2020 Einar Kvasager put in an application for a Veteran's Honor Flight Trip to Washington, D.C. Because of COVID, there were not trips made in 2020 or 2021. In March 2022, Einar received a call inviting him to travel on the April 2022 Veteran's Honor Flight.

At first there was some hesitation as to the possibility of him making the trip, due to the health conditions he has endured the past year with Esophageal Cancer.

The Veteran's Honor Flight of ND/MN has a team that fundraises to cover the cost of the trip for each Veteran, sends volunteers including medial staff to assist each need and condition of the Veterans. They made us feel confident Einar could make the trip along with his escort (step-daughter Jodi Kuznia). Einar's wife Carol traveled with her son Todd Mattison to meet Einar and Jodi and traveled with the Honor Flight of 85 Veterans on April 29, 30 and May 1st.

The plane received a "Water Canon Salute" from the Fire Department and a salute by a group of North Dakota National Guard. Einar's face lit up when he asked news personality, Mike Morken for a picture together! There were several media people who traveled along, covering the stories of the Veterans and their trip.

Einar was a member of the U.S. Army for two years following the Korean War. He was stationed in Korea for one year working security as a dog handler there. He made several life-long friends in the Army.

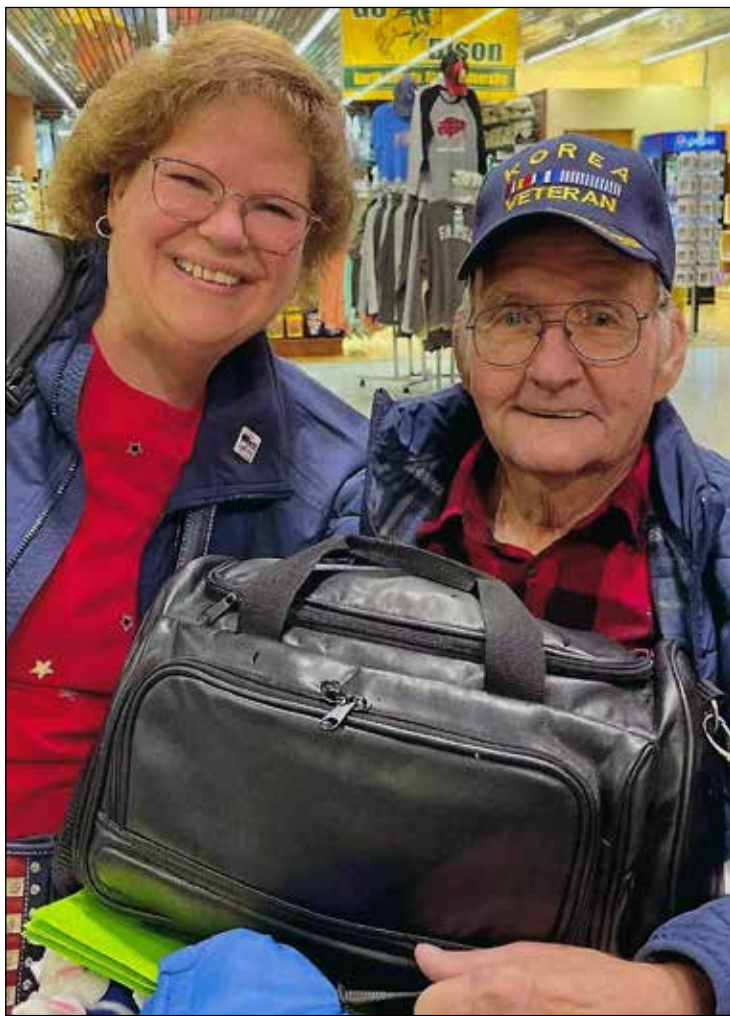
The first stop on the Veteran's Honor Flight trip was at Fort McHenry which is considered the home of the Star-Spangled Banner. There are historical sites of buildings and cannons used on the waterfront there.

Next, we traveled to the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, this was Carol's favorite stop along the water with views of the Washington and Jefferson Memorials, in a setting of waterfalls and flowering trees.

On Sunday, Einar experienced a health issue and was cared for by VA Dr. Carol Ness, so he could be rested up for a big banquet honoring the Veterans.

Todd & Jodi went on the days bus tours to Iwo Jima, Arlington National Cemetery, the Air Force Memorial, Korean and Vietnam War Memorials and Lincoln Monument. They took pictures for Einar and Carol of these events.

That evening a USO style program and banquet was held in honor of all the Veterans



who each received "Mail Call" letters of thanks for their service. This was a surprise for the Veterans. It was noted that in the 10-year history of the ND/MN Veteran's Honor Flight, that no one has ever received the amazing amount (more than 100) cards and letters that Einar received. Everyone loves Einar! Thank you to all Einar's family and friends for their love and support, it was truly heartfelt.

Monday, May 2nd, after breakfast, the group traveled past the Pentagon (Einar's favorite place to see), the White House, and the Capitol buildings on the way to the National Archives to view the U.S. Constitution, Bill of Rights, Declaration of Independence, and other historical documents being preserved in a special rotunda.

Next, we traveled past the WWII Memorial and several Smithsonian Institute Buildings on the way to the WWII Memorial. There were school groups of kids that lined the sidewalks who were applauding and thanking the veterans as they were going into the WWII Memorial. This was Jodi's favorite moment, seeing young people who truly appreciated the Veterans and their service for our freedom.

All the Veterans had a group picture taken at the memorial in their special shirts and hats

given to them from the Honor Flight of ND/MN. Another photo included the escorts, family and volunteers who traveled with the Veterans.

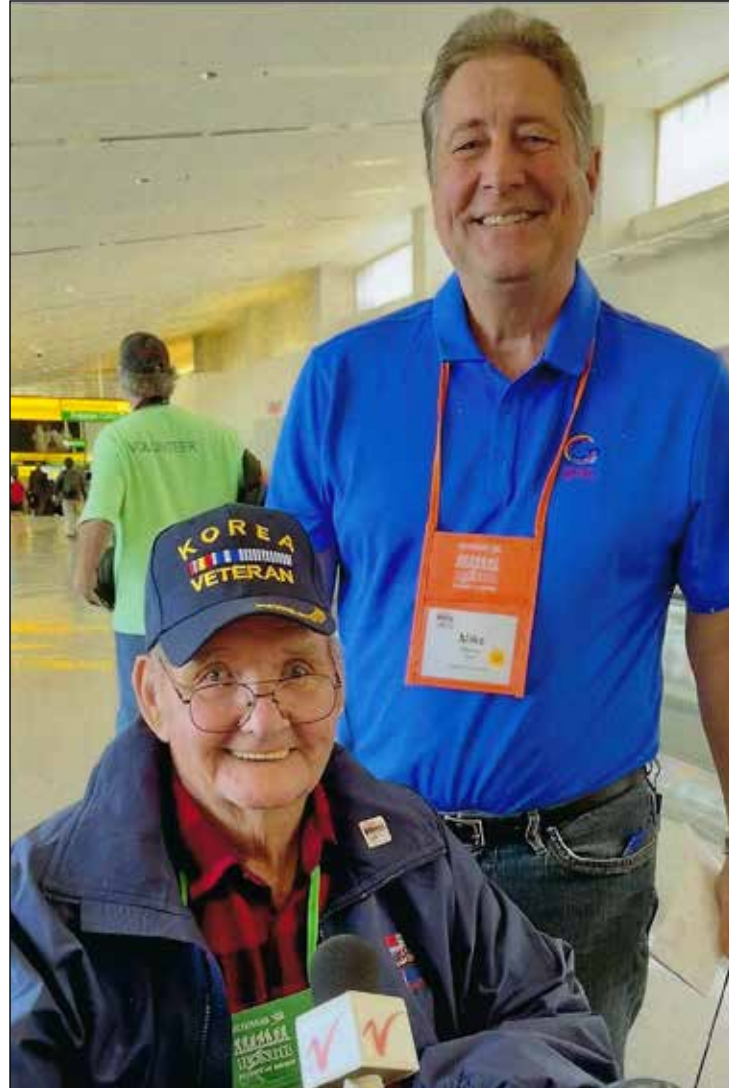

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Red Lake County Commissioners Minutes

RED LAKE COUNTY Regular Meeting Held May 24, 2022

Pursuant to adjournment of its last meeting the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners duly met in regular session at the Courthouse in Red Lake Falls, MN on May 24, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. Chair Weiss called the meeting to order. All Commissioners were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Flage and carried unanimously to approve the agenda.

County Engineer Erik Hove met with the board to request approval of a 6 & 7 Axle Special Permit for "Road Construction Materials". Several local contractors are requesting that the County allow special permits for road construction materials similar to the neighboring counties and MnDOT. Minnesota Statute 169.869 authorizes road authorities to issue annual permits for trucks configured to carry 90,000 pounds on six-axes and 97,000 pounds on seven-axes. The axle configuration must have all axes below 10-ton. Hove recommended that the county follow the same permit fees as neighboring counties and MnDOT in the following amounts:

\$300.00 annual fee for six-axle 90,000 pounds.
\$500.00 annual fee for seven-axle 97,000 pounds.

Hove informed the Red Lake County Highway Department implemented the online transportation permit system in the spring in 2021 and collected \$4,675.00 by the end of 2021 in online permit fees. The software fee costs \$1,500.00 annually. Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Flage and carried by unanimous vote to approve the request as presented.

Hove mentioned that he attended a meeting earlier in the day with FEMA. County damages are estimated at over \$100,000.00 from the spring flooding.

Commissioner Flage moved, seconded by Gerardy and carried

The motion included the following added expenses: \$434.39 to Dacotah Paper; \$97.11 expenses and \$570.00 per diem to Chuck Flage; \$56.16 expenses and \$160.00 per diem to John Dudycha; \$22.23 expenses and \$420.00 per diem to Allen Remick.

Environmental Officer Kurt Casavan met with the board to inform that there is a meeting with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency on June 1st in Crookston to discuss landfill options, available grant dollars, and the qualification issues with the Greater Minnesota Grant application submitted by the group of counties. Casavan informed that Stantec Engineering provided a revised estimate of \$113,250.00 to complete an engineering study for the group of seven counties.

Chairman Weiss discussed the COVID-19 County Leave Plan. The current plan will expire on May 31st. There was discussion on whether to extend the current plan again. Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Flage and carried by unanimous vote to extend the COVID-19 County Leave Plan to December 31, 2022.

Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Flage and carried unanimously to sponsor an ad for the Red Lake County Fair. The fair will be held June 23rd thru June 26th.

The following Commissioner/Committee reports were shared:

Commissioner	Reports
Dudycha:	-Inter County Community Council. Completed a director evaluation and policy review.
Flage:	-Inter County Nursing discussing staffing, COVID clinics and an environmental grant. Met with the County Attorney regarding the county redistricting plan.
Gerardy:	-None.
Remick:	-Meetings of Alumna and the NW Regional Emergency Communications Board.
Weiss:	-Met with the County Attorney regarding the county redistricting plan.

Auditor Schmitz informed that there is a Help America Vote Act (HAVA) grant available for election security items. The county has five years to spend the grant funding and there is no county match needed. A county resolution is required to submit with the application. Commissioner Flage moved and seconded by Gerardy to approve **Resolution No. 05-01-22 "HAVA Election Security Grant"**. The resolution reads:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners are hereby authorizing the County Auditor, Robert Schmitz, to apply for a Help America Vote Act (HAVA) Operating Grant on behalf of Red Lake County.

The motion was carried by unanimous vote. The Board Chair and Auditor were authorized to sign on the county's behalf. A complete document is available at the County Auditor's office.

There being no further business the regular board meeting adjourned to June 14, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

Stone City a rewarding read

"Would you believe in love at first sight?"

That's the question posed on the cover of Jeff Mitchell's heartwarming novel, Stone City, set in the iconic Grant Wood hill country of eastern Iowa. Mitchell, former dean of industrial technology at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and currently an educational consultant, has always lived in the Stone City area, the subject of a Wood painting.

Stone City tells how Ashley Morgan escaped a physically abusive relationship with her father only to find herself later struggling on her own, eventually entering a cold and loveless marriage. As she approaches middle age, Ashley virtually stumbles into Jaymes Fitzgerald, a talented graduate student, historian, artist and blues musician at a conference.

Despite a 14-year age difference, the sparks of romance begin. When she takes Jaymes up on a tour of Stone City and Grant Wood country on his 1942 Indian motorcycle, those sparks ignite into a flame.

It seems that everything is against them. Ashley is financially comfortable yet emotionally starved in her marriage.

She has three children she could never leave. And Jaymes is financially insecure at best. Yet Jaymes' free-spiritedness warms Ashley's heart in no way that her husband ever could.

A strong comparison could be made to Bridges of Madison County by Robert James Waller, only on a motorcycle. Like Waller's characters, they meet in an iconic and scenic

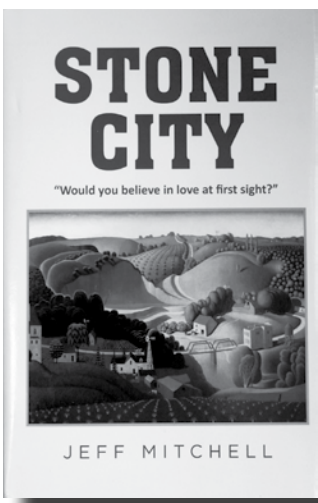
part of Iowa. However, such a comparison would be dismissive of the true depth of their characters.

Mitchell explores how Ashley and Jaymes overcome the pain that haunts them both. Jaymes shows Ashley the only true, unbridled love she has ever known, and Ashley inspires him to his greatest artistic accomplishment.

Telling more of their story would be a spoiler. Let's just say this is a very moving novel that would engage anyone interested in Iowa, Grant Wood or the incredible idea that such deep love between two people could actually happen. Stone City is more than a romance. It's a novel of hopeful possibilities meeting reality in a very meaningful way.

While the ending may be unexpected, it shows how the characters help each other reach their ultimate destiny, but in different ways. Stone City is a very satisfying story of indelibly memorable characters that will keep you thinking long afterward.
