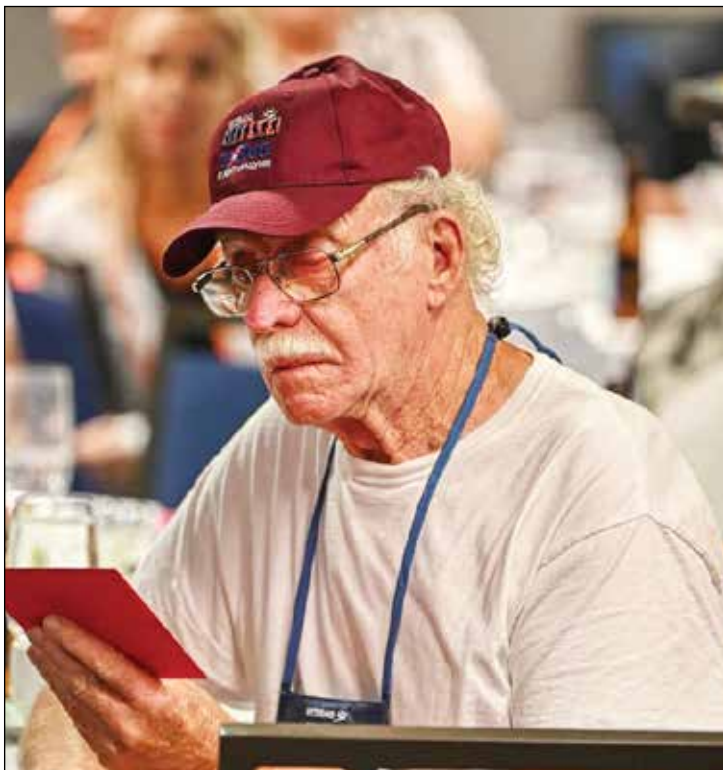
Eldin Okstad goes on Honor Flight to Washington, DC

An Honor Flight left Grand Forks for a 3-day trip to Washington, DC. Eldin Okstad of Gully was one of the 100 veterans chosen to go on the flight. What started when his wife Alice saw an ad on TV to get an application for the trip. A post card came and he was put on a wait list. COVID shut everything down.

After a year and a half, he received a letter from Fargo, North Dakota that he was selected for the Honor Flight. The veterans Honor Flight is a national organization all free to veterans that is run by volunteers. It is not associated with the government. The cost

per veteran is approximately \$1,600 for everything, the flight, hotel guides and tours.

The group left Grand Forks by Allegiant Air Lines for Baltimore and Washington International airport. They were put on buses coded, blue, green, orange, and red to being their tour that started at Ft. McHenry. They walked and looked around the building before they drove by the Capitol and White House en route to the FDR Memorial. The tour ended Sunday at their Marriott Hotel with a dinner and social hour. Monday, they boarded their color-coded buses and toured the National Archives, Navy



Memorial, Air Force Memorial where they were each given a box meal. They arrived at Arlington National and Cemetery for the Changing of the Guard Ceremony. That was a very impressive ceremony. From there to the Iwo Jima memorial.

They had beautiful weather, and the general public was very nice to them. They returned to their hotel for a social hour and dinner with a special speaker. That ended with a Mail Call of almost 2,000 letters that were passed around. The organizers of the event contacted families of each veteran to write letters thanking them for their service.

Eldin's wife Alice had mentioned that to several people, and they all sent letters that were brought to Washington for the mail call. Just like when they were in the military service to get mail call. Tuesday was another busy day as they headed for the WWII Memorial and photo of the group. They

also saw the Vietnam Wall, Korean Memorial and Lincoln Memorial. Eldin was glad to see the real Vietnam Wall after seeing it when it was in Gonvick this past summer. They had another box lunch at the Lincoln Memorial before the American History Smithsonian.

Eldin served four years in the Navy from 1969 to 1972. He was at San Diego and then on to Vietnam. He served on the USS Iwo Jima, a helicopter and troop carrier. He did not know what to do after he got out of the Navy, so he went to the University on the GI Bill. He did not want to become a teacher, so he started driving truck, and doing plumbing and carpentry work. Which he still does a little of today.

Returning late on Tuesday the group was greeted by relatives and friends and an assembly of police cars. What a special way to honor Veterans who have so bravely served.

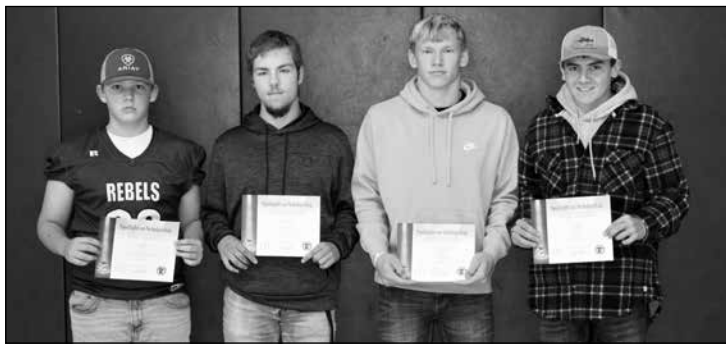
