



RLC Rebels defeat ABW Cougars to play in Section Championship



Pictured above is the RLCC Rebel football team after defeating the Cougars of Ada-Borup West. The win earned the Rebels a chance to play for the Section Championship against Mahnomen on Thursday, November 3rd at the Fargo Dome.

The Red Lake County Rebels would head to Ada on October 29th for the Section 8A semi-finals match-up with the Ada-Borup West Cougars.

RLC would start the game fast, after pressuring the Cougars with a pass rush, the Rebels would force a punt to

give them the ball in great field position.

The offense of the Rebel would then use that field position to drive to the Cougar 7. On 4th down, Damon Ferguson would find Carson Erickson in the endzone for the touchdown pass. Ferguson would add the

PAT and RLC had a 8-0 lead.

The Rebel pass rush continued on the next series. That rush would lead to a pressured throw and a Ferguson interception that was returned 31 yards for the touchdown. Ferguson passed the ball to Owen Chervestad for the PAT and

RLC had a 16-0 lead.

Much of the rest of the half, both teams relied on their defenses. ABW would drive to the Rebel one yard line with 28 seconds left but a fumble recovery by Connor Duden would keep the score at 16-0 at half.

The 3rd quarter would also

see the defenses of both teams control the game. RLC would get things going at the end of the 3rd before finishing the drive at the beginning of the 4th with a 17 yard Ferguson run to take a 24-0 lead.

ABW would try to muster a comeback, but RLC would force

another fumble. The Rebels would then run out the clock for the 24-0 win.

Ferguson had 71 yards rushing while Brock Seeger added 65 and Chervestad added 36.

RLC moves to 8-2 on the season and advances to the Section 8A Championship game.

Red Lake County Commissioner's Minutes

RED LAKE COUNTY Regular Meeting Held September 27, 2022

Pursuant to adjournment of its last meeting, the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners duly met in regular session at the Courthouse in Red Lake Falls, MN on September 27, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. All commissioners were present. Chair Weiss called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Interim County Engineer Mike Flaagen of Pennington County met with the board to introduce himself and to provide an update on both Pennington & Red Lake County projects including the Plummer City project. Paving on the Plummer City project is anticipated by mid-October with the final overlay completed in spring, 2023. Also discussed were the proposed plans for the CSAH 222 project at Oklee.

Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Remick to approve the September 13, 2022 minutes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Flage moved, second by Gerardy and carried by unanimous vote to approve the expenditures for the period as follows:

Nursing Service meeting discussing the financial review to submit to state, flu shot clinics being conducted, and the collaborative grant.

Dudycha: Nothing to report.

Gerardy: Nothing to report.

Remick: Provided updates on meetings of NW Mental Health, NW EMS, RLC Hazardous Planning Committee.

Weiss: Noted that NW HRA invited him to attend the next meeting.

Commissioner Gerardy moved to approve the mileage reimbursement for 2021-2022 for the Extension Committee members, seconded by Dudycha and carried unanimously.

and to authorize the Auditors Office to issue payment.

Commissioner Dudycha moved, seconded by Flage and carried by unanimous vote to approve

Resolution 09-03-22: "Resolution Approving State of MN Joint Powers Agreements with the County of Red Lake on behalf of its County Sheriff and Attorney".

WHEREAS, the County of Red Lake on behalf of its County Sheriff and Attorney desires to enter Joint Powers Agreements with the State of Minnesota, Department of Apprehension to use systems and tools available over the State's criminal justice data communications network for which the County is eligible. The Joint Powers Agreements further provide the County with the

ability to add, modify and delete connectivity, systems and tools over the five-year life of the agreement and obligates the County to pay the costs for the network connection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Red Lake County, Minnesota as follows:

1. That the State of Minnesota Joint Powers Agreements by and between the State of Minnesota acting through its Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension and the County of Red Lake on behalf of its County Sheriff and Attorney are hereby approved.

2. That the Red Lake County Sheriff, Mitch Bernstein, or his successor, is designated the Authorized Representative for the Sheriff. The Authorized Representative is also authorized to sign any subsequent amendment or agreement that may be required by the State of Minnesota to maintain the County's connection to the systems and tools offered by the State.

3. That the Red Lake County Attorney, Michael LaCoursiere, or his successor, is designated the Authorized Representative for the County Attorney. The Authorized Representative is also authorized to sign any subsequent amendment or agreement that may be required by the State of Minnesota to maintain the County's connection to the systems and tools offered by the State.

4. That Ronald Weiss, the Chair of the County of Red Lake, and Robert Schmitz, the County Board Clerk, are authorized to sign the State of Minnesota Joint Powers Agreements.

Commissioner Gerardy moved and seconded by Remick to approve appointment of Social Service Director Kristi Nelson from part-time status to full time effective as of October 1, 2022 with full benefits. Voting for: Commissioners Gerardy, Remick, Flage, Weiss. Voting against: Commissioner Dudycha. The motion carried.

The County Board continued discussion on the 2023 proposed county budget. Auditor Schmitz presented detail information for the County Revenue Fund, including the Highway Department and Social Services budgets, and provided a summary of the overall county tax levy and budget. Schmitz also mentioned that the county's taxing capacity increased significantly due to the Enbridge Energy Line 3 expansion project. Additional discussion ensued. Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Remick and carried unanimously to adopt the proposed tax levy at \$4,044,877.00 less \$471,545.00 State County Program Aid, resulting in \$3,573,332.00 certified tax levy (11.3% increase) for the payable year 2023.

A discussion followed on MJB services and plan proposals on the various courthouse projects.

Motion by Commissioner Gerardy, seconded by Dudycha and carried to close the regular board meeting at 11:55 a.m. to discuss the IUOE contract negotiations. Motion by Commissioner Flage, seconded by Dudycha and carried to re-open the board meeting at 12:27 p.m.

The County Board recessed for lunch and returned at 1:00 p.m. to conduct additional interviews for the County Auditor position.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned until October 11, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

2022 Winter Hazard Awareness Week (WHAW) Nov. 14-18

As Winter Hazard Awareness Week approaches, local agencies, including the RLC Sheriff's Office, are sharing ways to stay safe this winter season. Read below for helpful tips regarding heating your home this winter.

Death and injury can be reduced with proper understanding and safe use of heating equipment. Safety should be your first consideration when heating your home. Remember these safety guidelines and tips:

PORTABLE AND SPACE HEATERS

• Portable heaters come in many shapes and sizes and use a variety of fuels or power sources. When buying or using a space or portable heater, make sure it carries a UL or FM label and is approved for your intended use.

• Place heating devices three feet away from combustibles, including paper, drapery, bedding and clothing.

• Space heaters need constant watching. Turn them off when you leave home and before bedtime.

• Drying mittens or other combustibles over a space or portable heater is a fire danger.

• Make sure all cords are in good shape and checked for any frays/breaks in the insulation surrounding the wires.

• Check the cord and outlet for overheating. If it feels hot, turn it off.

LIQUID-FUELED AND GAS-BURNING HEATERS

• Any heating appliance with an open flame needs to be vented to outside to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.

• When using these types of heating devices, follow manufacturers' instructions and recommendations.

• Cool units before refueling; this should take place

outside of the structure. Fuel must be stored in a container approved by the fire department and clearly marked with the fuel name.

WOOD STOVES

• Follow manufacturers' recommendations for proper installation, use and maintenance.

• Properly ventilate the stove. Other household venting appliances can diminish proper venting. Test all other appliances (bathroom fans, stovetop venting, HVAC units, etc.) to ensure they don't interfere with venting.

• Maintain clearances around stoves, flue pipes, and floors according to manufacturers' recommendations.

• Check all connections at the beginning of the heating season.

• If you have questions about fire protection devices, contact your local fire department.

FIREPLACES AND WOOD BURNING STOVES

Preventive:

• Chimneys need to be inspected by a professional sweep prior to the start of each heating season and periodically throughout the year

• Have chimneys cleaned if there is a buildup of creosote. Creosote is a chemical substance that forms when wood burns and builds up on the chimney wall. It is highly combustible.

Active:

• Fireplace screens should be firmly in place when you burn fires.

• Burn only clean, well-seasoned, dry firewood in the fireplace.

• Make sure home smoke detectors are installed and working.

Old South Brunswick Stew

This was my Dad's favorite meal. He would ask me to make a batch of it every time I went to visit him and he'd stock his freezer full!

- 1 (3 to 4 lb) fryer
- 1 (3 lb) chuck roast
- 1 (3 lb) pork roast (boston butt)
- 6 cans whole tomatoes, squeezed
- 6 cans white shoepeg corn
- 4 large onions, chopped
- 4 lemons, sliced and seeded
- 2 large bottles worcestershire (10 oz)
- 1 large can tomato paste
- 1/4 cup sugar (or whatever you think a "touch" is)
- salt and pepper to taste

Cook the meats together in a large kettle of water, with salt and pepper until meat falls off bone (2-3 hrs). De-bone meat and chop with scissors or food processor. Meanwhile, put tomatoes, sauce, onions and lemons in a large pot on simmer (this saves on cooking time).
Add meat, with broth and turn heat to low and cook, stirring constantly, until onions are soft. Add tomato paste and continue to cook down for at least 4 hours. Add corn at the end, as it tends to scorch. Skim off all fat possible. I'm not sure, but this has been served at many family reunions and should serve at least 20.



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
