Rebel Season ends after loss to MW Thunderbirds in Section Final

Captains for the RLC Rebels are pictured with their Section Runner-Up trophy following the loss to Mahnomen-Waubun on Thursday, November 3rd at the Fargo Dome. The Rebels finished their season with a record of 8 wins and 3 losses.

The 8-2 Red Lake County Rebels would head to Fargo on November 3rd to take on the number one seed, with an 8-1 record, Mahnomen-Waubun Thunderbirds. The winner would be crowned the Section 8A Champions and move to the state football tournament. The T-Birds would get the ball first. Patiently they moved the ball down the field and after 9 minutes and 18 plays, they would punch a score in and take a 8-0 lead. After a turnover for the

Rebels, the M-W offense would be at it again. They would slowly gain yards each play and move down the field. After adding another touchdown and a field goal, the Thunderbirds would take a 19-0 lead into the locker room. The 3rd quarter saw the Rebels hold the Thunderbirds scoreless. However, the RLC offense would struggle all day long to be able to move the ball. The Rebels ended the day with 5 turnovers, and in the end lost 32-0. The 2022 RLC Rebels end

their season at 8-3 and are the Section 8A runner-ups. "It was a tough day for us, we couldn't do a lot on offense and couldn't get off the field on defense. It is a tough pill to swallow but...we need to look at the big picture. We had a great season, the kids worked hard and played well together all year. We are very proud of them all. Special thanks to our 7 seniors, they are great young men and great leaders," noted Coach Brian Remick.

Minnesota Sheriff's Association offers scholarships- deadline November 19th

Sheriff Mitch Bernstein of Red Lake County announced the commencement of the Law Enforcement Scholarship Program for 2022. The MSA Board of Directors has established a scholarship fund for the awarding of up to 20- \$2,000 scholarships for this year. These scholarships are due to the coordinated efforts of the 87 Sheriffs of the State of Minnesota. The Members of MSA gives special recognition to the financial needs of students attending the peace officer skills course, or one of the two or four-year law enforcement degree colleges. "The Board of Directors feel peace officers in our society have complex duties to perform," said Sheriff Bernstein. MSA recognizes the importance of pre-entry training for people considering law enforcement as their career choice. MSA recognizes some students need outside help in meeting the costs of such training, even though they excel academically. The Scholarship Committee, in making its selection of

awards, intends on achieving representation from all geographical areas of the state. Scholarship awards will be announced by December 28 th of the same year. Application forms and a statement of procedures are available at the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office. Scholarships are only available to students currently enrolled in one of the following three categories:
1. Mandated POST Skills Program
2. In their second year of a two-year law enforcement program.
3. In their third or fourth year of a four-year college criminal justice program. In order to qualify, students must have completed at least one year of the two-year program or two years of a four-year program. Students meeting these criteria are invited to obtain a scholarship application form from their local sheriff's office or online at www.mn-sheriffs.org. Applications must be submitted by November 19, 2022.

"Sky high" Turkey prices this Holiday Season

Families can expect their holiday turkeys to be more expensive than ever this year due to the combination of inflation and avian influenza. The price of uncooked poultry, including turkey, was up 17% in September from the same time last year, according to the Consumer Price Index. Michael Boland, a professor in the College of Food, Agricultural and Natural Resource Sciences, commented on why the price of turkey is rising dramatically in 2022. "As we've seen over the last several months, food prices across the board are on the rise, and the Thanksgiving turkey is no exception. Not only are turkey suppliers dealing with inflation and the rising costs of packaging, transportation and energy — but this year farmers are also battling avian influenza." "Over 250 commercial bird flocks across the country have been affected, according to the USDA. The deadly disease means limited availability, which is contributing to higher prices at the grocery store. Restaurant and food service will likely have smaller sized turkeys due to the shortage."

RED LAKE COUNTY Regular Meeting Held October 11, 2022

Pursuant to adjournment of its last meeting, the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners duly met in regular session at the Courthouse in Red Lake Falls, MN, on October 11, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. Chair Weiss called the meeting to order. All commissioners were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Gerardy moved and seconded by Flage to approve the minutes of the September 27, 2022 regular board meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Flage moved, seconded by Gerardy and carried by unanimous vote to approve the expenditures for the period as follows:

HR Director Lundeen informed on an upcoming Department Head meeting. Lundeen reported that the 2023 Health insurance rates were received from Mike Reishus of North Risk Partners in Thief River Falls. The rates increased significantly so Reishus will start the process to seek rate quotes (RFP) from other health insurance providers.

The board discussed listing property tax information onto the county website. Auditor Schmitz will contact the tax vendor to inquire on cost to implement.

There was discussion on the applicants that were interviewed to replace Auditor Bob Schmitz who is retiring at the end of his elected term on January 3, 2023. Commissioner Dudycha moved and seconded by Remick to appoint Kelsey Gervais as Red Lake County Auditor effective January 3, 2023 with an employment date of October 24, 2022 at a Grade 22-Step 1 with an increase to Step 2 upon satisfactory completion of the 6-month probationary period. The motion was carried with Commissioner Flage abstaining.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned until October 25, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

SPECIAL AGRICULTURAL HOMESTEAD

The special Agricultural Homestead Provision was created to extend homestead status (which can result in lower property taxes) to those property owners, or their sons and daughters, who actively farm the land. The 1999 Minnesota Legislature passed legislation that extended the homestead classification to certain farmland that is not immediately adjacent to an owner's place of residence. The 2000 Legislation also extended the homestead to members of homestead or non-contiguous farmland under the following conditions.

Agricultural property consisting of at least 40 acres shall be classified homestead to the same extent as other agricultural property if all the following criteria are met:

- 1- The owner, or the owner's spouse, or child, grandchild, sibling or parent of the owner or owner's spouse either on the person's own behalf as an individual or on behalf of a qualified entity in which they are a partner, shareholder, or member actively farms the agricultural property,
 - 2- The owner of an agricultural property is a MN resident,
 - 3- Neither the owner nor their spouse may claim another agricultural homestead in MN,
 - 4- The owner does not live farther than four townships or cities or a combination of four townships or cities from the agricultural property, and
 - 5- Be listed as a farmer/operator by the Farm Service Agency {Form 156-EZ}
 - 6- File a Schedule F with their federal income tax return.
- The following definition constitutes "actively farming" persons engaged in actively farming must participate in the day-to-day labor, administration, and management of the farm. They must assume all or a portion of the financial risks and they must participate in any profits and losses.

Additionally:
The farmland must be a minimum of 40 acres in size and:
The farmland must meet the definition of agricultural property contained in MN Statutes 273.124, Subd. 14(b)
Land enrolled in CRP or RIM do not qualify for the homestead classification, it will continue to be classified as agricultural.

This special homestead provision is only available to qualified individual who make application by the filing deadline of December 31, 2022. To find out how to apply for the special agricultural homestead and receive the proper applications contact:

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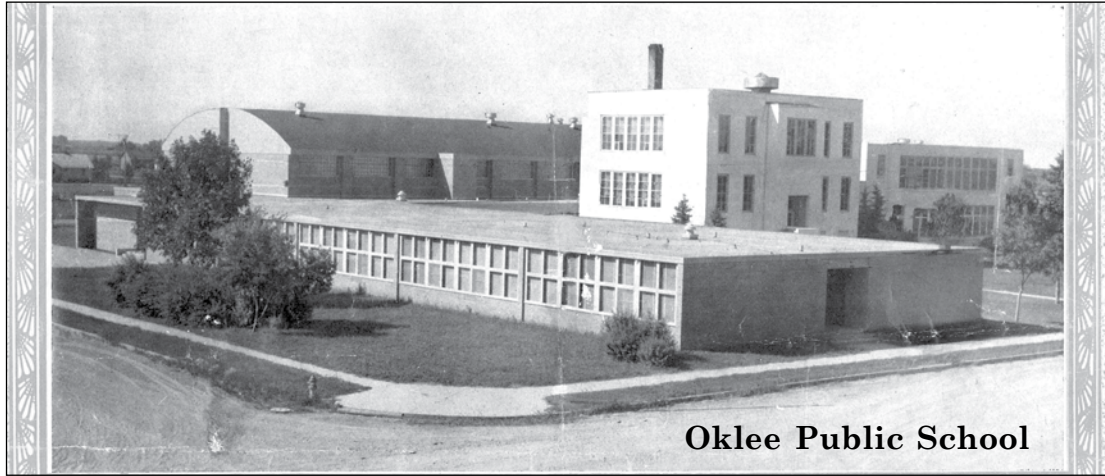

Novel takes aim at Big Ag

As the saying goes, art imitates life. One could say Sandy Moffett's entertaining and enlightening novel, *The Ghost of Craven Snuggs*, has a whole lot of life to it.

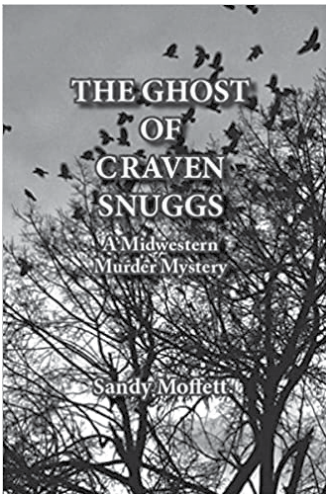
Moffett, emeritus professor of theatre at Grinnell College in Grinnell, Iowa, has taken aim at vertically integrated Big Ag like triple-ought buckshot on an Iowa pheasant.

The story begins when Craven Snuggs' house and barn mysteriously burn to the ground. Just before he enters his barn to save his horses, Snuggs says prophetically, "You ain't seen the last of me." The flaming barn then collapses with Snuggs presumably still inside.

We segue to a series of missing portraits of the owners of multi-level livestock corporations – Hubert Wooten, James Schittman and Donald Birdseed. Two of the owners, Wooten and Schittman, are later found half-eaten in hog confinements they own with their portraits hanging nearby. Birdseed is discovered floating inside a bundle of garbage in a sewage lagoon. Co-incidents? Maybe not.

What really turns up the heat on the case is the governor's missing portrait. He naturally believes he will follow the same fate.

With the governor commandeering the entire state's law enforcement team for his personal protection, it falls on small-town sheriff Patrick Kavanaugh to solve the murders. Since his department is limited to a secretary and a pair of easily confused identical twins named Phil and Bill, Kavanaugh hires an unlikely trove of deputies, including Shawn Gallagher, former ag professor infamous for his demonstrations against Big

Ag, including an appearance before a public hearing in a pig suit. Gallagher, incidentally, is the initial prime suspect in the murders.

Gallagher soon exonerates himself, though, as do the trophy-wife widows of the three corporate executives who seem more than happy to be shed of their husbands and inherit their money.

Still, the murders remain unresolved. As suspect after suspect is crossed off the pictures on Kavanaugh's wall, the only remaining suspect is Snuggs' ancient International pickup that seems to have appeared then disappeared at each crime scene.

Moffett's criticism of corporate agriculture is laced with gut-wrenching humor. Those unfamiliar with Iowa's ag policy will find the novel both entertaining and enlightening. Those who understand the DNR's Master Matrix that evaluates animal confinements will cringe at how closely Moffett has come to his target. Those involved in vertically integrated agriculture might have an entirely different take on the book.
