Although many of her peers are also in a similar stage in life, Sophia is doing something that puts her into a unique category. She is a beekeeper, and has been since 2019. After researching and discussing with her parents, Ted and Jennifer Linder, they decided it was an adventure they would take on. "Sophie's Bees - Garnes Grown" was born and has been a focus of hers ever since. At the beginning handling the bees was a challenge, but with time, practice and mentorship from an experienced beekeeper, she grew in confidence in her craft.

In the Spring, when the weather begins to warm up, Sophia makes plans for her bees to return to Garnes township, where they will stay until the cold weather returns. Last season, Sophie had the most bees she has had yet. Beekeeping is a labor of love, and Sophia does love it.

Collecting honey is a highlight of beekeeping. Sophia makes homemade honey from her bees and sells it locally. Local honey can be a great way to combat allergies for those who suffer the most when the air is filled with pollen.
