Severe Weather Awareness Week April 17-21

Severe Weather Awareness Week, April 17 - April 21. Red Lake County will be conducting Tornado Drills on Thursday 4/20. The weather warning sirens in Red Lake County's cities will be sounded at 1:45pm and again at 6:45pm that day.

Each year, the Minnesota Department of Public Safety (in partnership with the National Weather Service and other state and local government agencies) sponsors Severe Weather Awareness Week. Each day of the week focuses on a different topic. The highlight are two statewide tornado drills on Thursday.

Siren and NOAA Weather Radio Activation

During the afternoon and evening drills, local sirens and all NOAA Weather Radios in Minnesota and Wisconsin will sound with a simulated tornado warning. These drills give everyone the opportunity to review their emergency plans and procedures and practice emergency drills at work or at home.

Remember - counties and cities in Minnesota own, op-

erate and maintain all local warning sirens, and set their own policies on how and when they are activated. Please check with your local public safety officials for details on when warning sirens are sounded in your community. There is no such thing as an all-clear siren.

The Drills

The first drill occurs on Thursday, April 20 at 1:45 p.m., when jurisdictions across Minnesota sound their outdoor warning sirens. Schools, businesses and other facilities are encouraged to conduct a tornado drill at this time to practice their emergency tornado sheltering plans. NOAA Weather Radios will activate with the weekly test code.

A second drill occurs on Thursday, April 20 at 6:45 p.m., when jurisdictions across Minnesota sound their outdoor warning sirens. This second drill allows second-shift workers, individuals and families the opportunity to practice their own emergency plans at home. NOAA Weather Radios will activate with the weekly

test code.

Schedule of Events

Simulated tornado watches and warnings will be issued to test the statewide warning and communications systems. The schedule is as follows:

1 p.m.: All National Weather Service (NWS) offices that serve Minnesota will issue a simulated tornado using the Public Information Statement product. NOAA Weather Radios will activate with the weekly test code.

1:45 p.m.: The NWS will issue a simulated tornado warning for Minnesota using the Public Information Statement product. Most cities and counties will activate outdoor warning sirens.

2 p.m.: The NWS will issue an "End of Test" message using the Public Information Statement product.

6:45 p.m.: NWS offices will issue another simulated tornado warning.

7 p.m.: The NWS will issue an "End of Test" message using the Public Information Statement product.

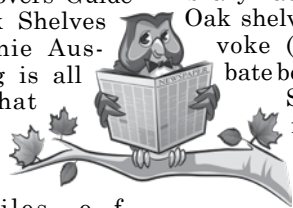

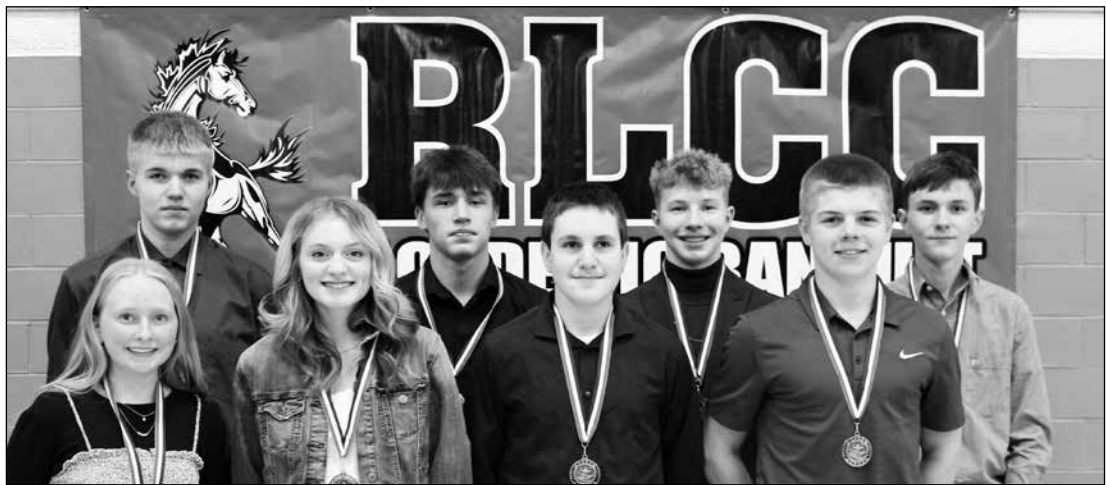

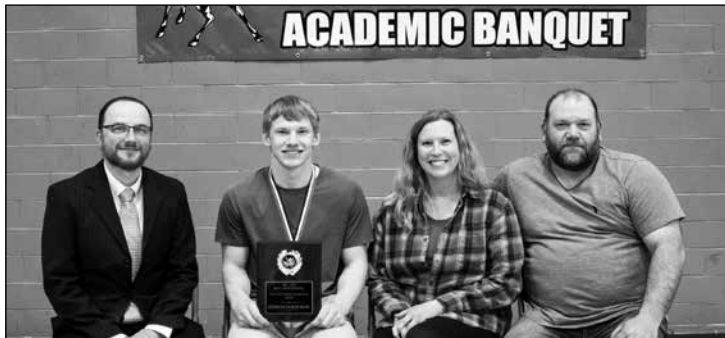

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## Red Lake County Sheriff Weekly News Release

On the evening of 03/31/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report that some domesticated dogs were running loose, and attacking a deer, near the hockey arena in Red Lake Falls. A Red Lake County deputy responded to the area and found that dogs had killed a deer. The owner of the dogs was contacted, and they came to the scene to take control of their dogs.

Daniel Patrick Stephens (40) of Red Lake Falls was cited for violating the city's ordinance by allowing his dogs to run at large. He was allowed to take his dogs home and was advised not to let them run loose again or he could face additional criminal charges.

On the morning of 04/01/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report of a possible break-in at an apartment building in Red Lake Falls. That report remains under investigation.

On the morning of 04/01/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report of harassment amongst neighbors in Red Lake Falls. The involved parties were counseled by a deputy and they were advised to not have contact with each other. No crimes had been committed and the matter was mediated.

On the afternoon of 04/01/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report from Brent's Grocery Store, that previously trespassed individuals were causing problems at that location and they were violating the trespass order.

A Red Lake County deputy investigated the report and cited two parties with misdemeanor trespassing. Christopher Aundrius Hofer (41) of Red Lake Falls and Clifford Earl Magnussen II (41) of Red Lake Falls received citations

and they will be summonsed to appear in Court in Red Lake Falls later this month. They were also advised to stay off any Brent's Grocery property.

On the evening of 04/01/23, a Red Lake County deputy stopped a vehicle on Hwy. #32 north of Red Lake Falls for an equipment violation. A passenger in the vehicle, Liana Brooks (43) of Red Lake Falls was arrested because she had an active misdemeanor warrant in Red Lake County. The deputy also discovered that the driver, Richard John Rud (53) of Thief River Falls, possessed illegal controlled substances and did not have a valid driver's license. He was also arrested. Both individuals were taken to jail in Crookston. Mr. Rud was booked for gross misdemeanor possession of illegal controlled substances, gross misdemeanor driving after cancelation (inimical to public safety), misdemeanor no proof of current motor vehicle insurance and possession of drug paraphernalia. Both of them appeared in Court in Crookston on 04/03/23. Ms. Brook was released from custody and Mr. Rud was ordered to pay \$1,000 cash bail prior to his release. He remains in custody at this time.

On the evening of 04/02/23, a Red Lake County deputy responded to a report of a domestic disturbance at a Louisville Township residence. It was determined that no crimes had been committed and the parties were counseled and the situation was mediated.

On the evening of 04/03/23, a Red Lake County deputy stopped a vehicle on Main Ave. in Red Lake Falls for an equipment violation. The deputy suspected that the driver of the vehicle, James Michael Dahlin (37) of Thief River

Falls, was under the influence of illegal controlled substances. Further investigation during the stop led to the discovery of several grams of methamphetamine, a substantial amount of marijuana, Oxycontin pills, a large amount of cash, a scale and packaging materials. Mr. Dahlin was arrested and taken to jail in Crookston. He was booked for felony possession of illegal controlled substances, misdemeanor possession of marijuana and misdemeanor driving while under the influence of illegal controlled substances. Mr. Dahlin appeared in Court in Crookston on 04/04/23. He was ordered to post \$30,000 cash bail prior to his release and he remains in custody.

On the morning of 04/04/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a child protection report concerning the welfare of some minor children in Oklee. That report remains under investigation.

On the afternoon of 04/05/23, Red Lake County deputies arrested Dean Matthew Thomas Columbus-Kalstabakken (48) of Plummer. He was arrested at his home for violating the conditions of his release from a previous charge. Mr. Columbus-Kalstabakken was taken to jail in Crookston and was booked for misdemeanor contempt of court.

On the morning of 04/06/23, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office had a vehicle towed from Main Ave. in Red Lake Falls. It had been parked in violation of the city's ordinance and it was interfering with snow removal efforts. The owner of the vehicle, James Michael Dahlin (37) of Thief River Falls was also cited for the ordinance violation.
