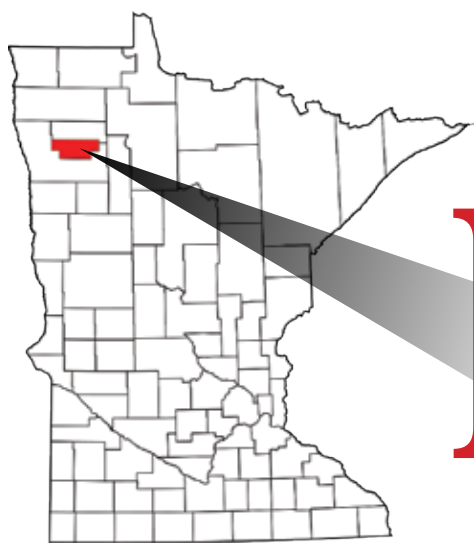

Road Work Update for this Summer!

I have been asked many times about the upcoming roadwork on former Highway 222 from Oklee to Highway 92. I received this update from Taylor Amiot, RLC Engineer.

The project design was completed this winter by Moore Engineering. There will be portions of City funded work completed as part of this project as well. The County portions of the project will entail the following major work items as well as smaller ancillary and incidental tasks:

Red Lake County:

Full reconstruct of CSAH 53 from MN T.H. 92 to CSAH 53 / 1st Avenue in Oklee and regrading of the road and ditch sections to comply with current standards. Also centerline culverts will be replaced as well as approach reconstruction and culvert replacement. Mill & Overlay of CSAH 5 from CSAH 53 / 1st Ave to the southern bridge abutment at the Lost River will take place.

The guardrail will be replaced at the Lost River. Street lighting from County Road 131 / 7th Ave. to 224th St SE / CP

Railroad will also be done.

In the city of Oklee pavement resurfacing will be done at the following locations:

4th Ave. from CSAH 5 to Toupin St, 4th Ave. from Elm St. to Oak St.

Lambert St. from south end to 5th Ave, Bourden St. from north of 6th St. to 5th Ave.

Some work will also be done by others such as replacing of the railroad crossing.

Moore Engineering was also tasked to perform landowner negotiations and to obtain both temporary and permanent construction easements, which they have agreements from all affected parties. The project will be out for bids starting Tuesday, April 23rd through Tuesday, May 28th when bids will be opened. Construction is anticipated to begin in early June with the completion date set for October 18th, 2024.

That is a synopsis of the upcoming road construction for this summer! No one likes the inconvenience of road work but the end result should be appreciated! Thanks Taylor for the update!

Construction on Highway 220 north of East Grand Forks begins May 13

Motorists will detour utilizing 150th St. NE, Polk County roads 66 and 23

The Minnesota Department of Transportation announced today, construction on Highway 220 north of East Grand Forks will begin May 13. The project includes reconstructing Highway 220 to a concrete road from Polk CR 19 to Polk CR 22/23. Culvert replacements will also be constructed throughout the project. Motorists will detour utilizing 150th St SW and Polk County roads 66 and 23.

The project is expected to be complete in mid-August, weather permitting. For more information as well as a detour map, visit the project website: www.mndot.gov/d2/projects/hwy220-egf.

Project benefits and cost

Benefits of the project include a safer road, improved drainage, and a smoother and longer lasting driving surface.

Michels Road & Stone is the contractor for the \$15.6 million project.

Important reminders for motorists regarding work zone safety:

Slow down when approaching every work zone, then navigate through with care and caution.

Stay alert; work zones constantly change.

Watch for workers and slow-moving equipment.

Obey posted speed limits. Fine for a violation in a work zone is \$300.

Minimize distractions behind the wheel.

Be patient; expect delays, especially during peak travel times.

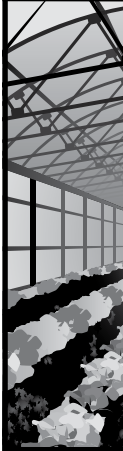

Artichoke Chicken Saute James and Stacy (Lambert) Rathke

1 small onion
1 medium red pepper
2 cups cooked chicken
1/2 cup mushrooms
1/2 cup chicken broth or white wine
1-1/2 tsp Italian seasoning
1 tsp chicken bouillon granules
salt and pepper to taste
2 Tbsp corn starch
1 cup whipping cream
egg noodles
1 can artichokes

In a skillet, saute the chopped onion and red pepper in butter for 2 - 3 minutes. Add chicken, artichokes, mushrooms, wine or broth, Italian seasoning, bouillon, salt and pepper. Cook and stir for 3 minutes. Combine the cornstarch and 1/2 cup cream until smooth; stir into skillet. Add the remaining cream. Bring to a boil and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Serve over noodles.

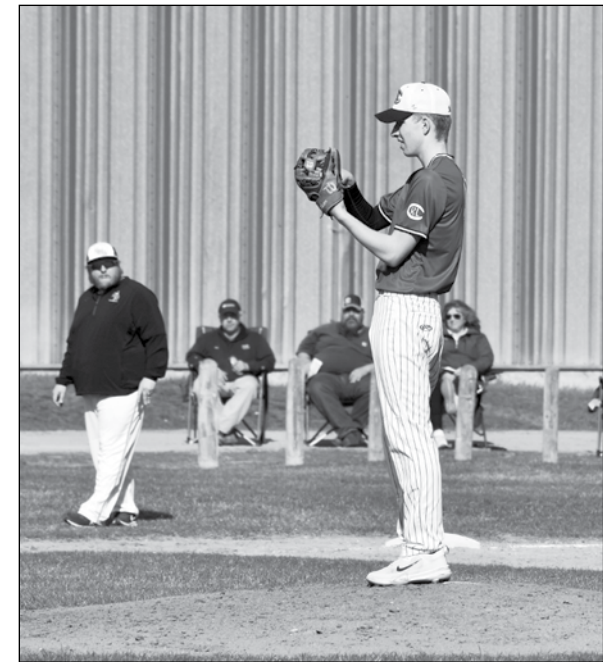

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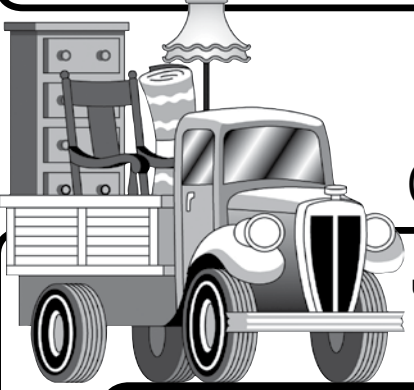
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Oklee Herald Early Files
