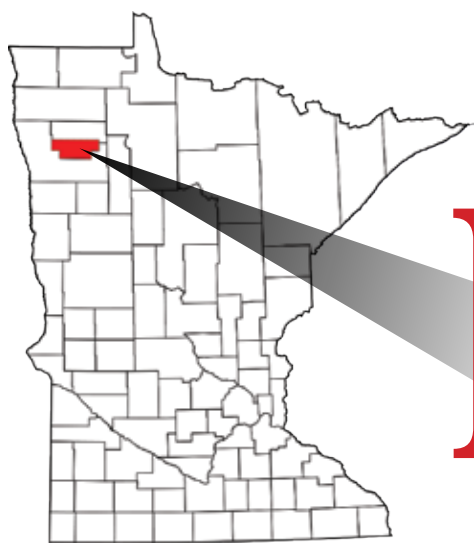

Military Vehicle Convoy to Roll Through Thief River Falls on October 1st

Thief River Falls, MN – September 3, 2024 – On October 1, 2024, Thief River Falls will proudly host the Military Vehicle Preservation Association's (MVPA) Convoy #8 as it traverses the historic Jefferson Highway.

This convoy, displaying approximately 35 antique military vehicles, is part of a nationwide journey stretching from the Minnesota border to New Orleans, Louisiana.

The convoy is sponsored by the MVPA Historical Archives, a non-profit organization established in 1976 with over 7,000 members in 20 countries. This remarkable event brings together history enthusiasts, including participants from as far away as New Zealand. One of the convoy's highlights will be a New Zealand Air Force vehicle, proudly owned by a Texan.

In conjunction with the convoy's arrival, Visit Thief River Falls is thrilled to announce the unveiling of a new historic landmark sign. This will be

the first Historic Marker for the Jefferson Highway in the state of Minnesota. The sign will be located near the Ralph Engelstad Arena to commemorate Thief River Falls' place in history along this famous route. The unveiling ceremony will take place at 5:00 PM, coinciding with the convoy's arrival.

Residents and visitors are encouraged to come out and see these vintage vehicles, which will be on display in the parking lot north of the American Legion from approximately 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. The MVPA convoy is not only a rolling museum of military history but also a testament to the dedication and passion of its members, who have meticulously maintained these vehicles.

"We are thrilled to be a part of this historic convoy and to showcase Thief River Falls as a significant stop along the Jefferson Highway," said Megan Maloney, Executive Director of Visit Thief River Falls. "The

convoy's visit, coupled with our new historic landmark sign, provides a unique occasion to honor the past and connect with the broader Jefferson Highway community."

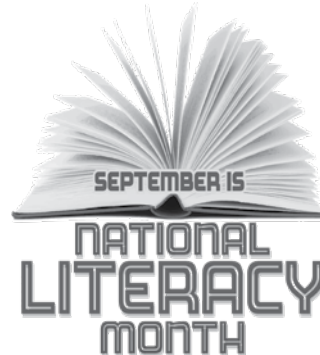

Rebels Improve Record 2-0

On Thursday, September 5th, 2024, The Red Lake County Rebels traveled by Red Lake to take on the Red Lake Warriors. The Rebels had a solid first quarter, with Brock Seeger scoring the first touchdown with a 42-yard gain. Kegan Schmitz had the extra point. Ethan Johnson would make the next touchdown with a 14-yard pass from Owen Chervestad. Kegan Schmitz got the extra point. With five minutes left of the first quarter, Owen Chervestad scored a touchdown with a 47-yard gain, with Schmitz kicking the extra point. Gunnar Halverson scored a touchdown for a 45-yard gain and Schmitz for the extra point with three minutes left of the first quarter. To end the quarter, Owen Chervestad passed to Luke Peterson for a 25-yard gain. Peterson would kick the extra point. The Rebels would end the first quarter with an impressive lead of 35 points.

The Rebels had another successful bid during the second quarter. Theo Tydlacka scored a touchdown for a 32-yard gain, with the extra point kicked by Kegan Schmitz. The Warriors scored their first touchdown with a 44-yard gain with six

minutes left of the quarter. Thoren Thronson scored a touchdown for a 19-yard gain, with Kegan kicking for the extra point. The Rebels would end the first half of the game with a 49-6 lead.

In the second half, the Rebels led the Warriors in points, with Sam Rath scoring a touchdown with a 14-yard gain and Kegan Schmitz scoring the extra point. Red Lake scored their second touchdown of the evening with an impressive 85-yard gain and then made the two-point conversion run. Masen Williams would score the night's final touchdown with a 21-yard gain. Schmitz would make this 8th extra point kick of the night. At the night's end, the Rebels won the game with a 63-14 win. Next week's Stampede will celebrate the Rebels win over Lake Park Audobon, increasing their record to 3-0.

The Rebels will take on Menagha for their Homecoming Game in Oklee on September 20th. The game will also be aired on Channel 35. On Friday, September 27th, The Rebels will host Mahnomen/Waubun in Red Lake Falls at the L.E. Dreschel Field. Good luck to the Rebels.

Anne Traxler, Anna DeHate and Alice Jobe enjoyed Uff Da Taco's for lunch.

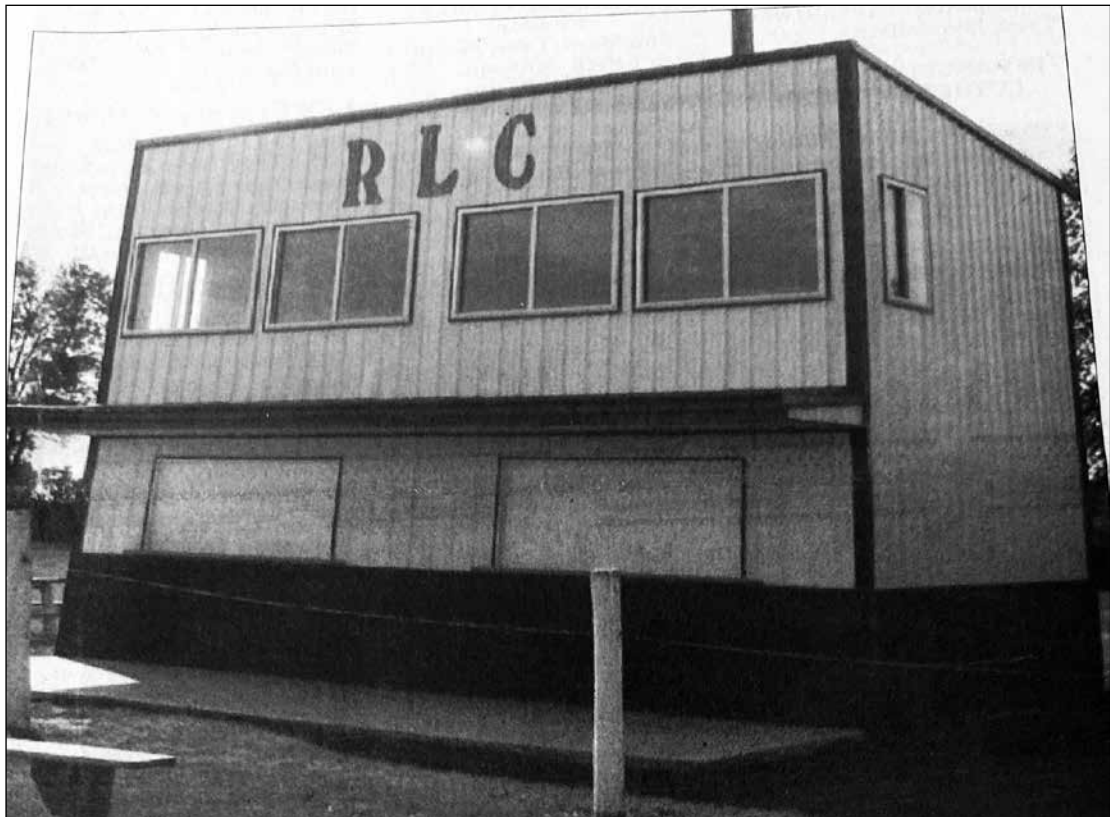
The Car Show was very interesting. There were somewhere around ninety cars and
