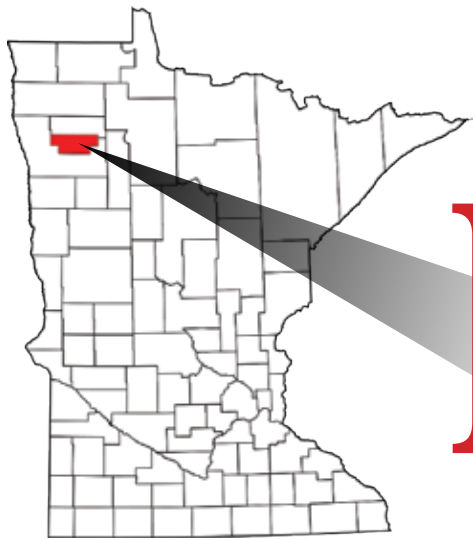

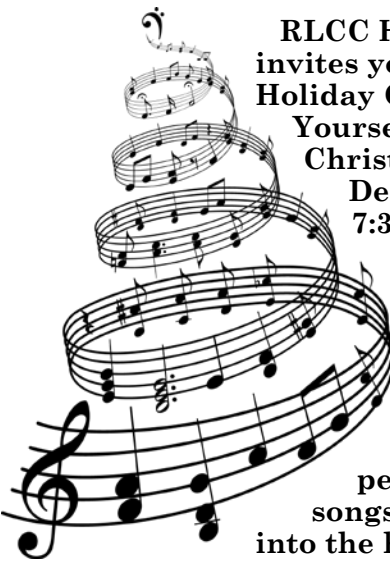

Red Lake County Central Mustangs Leap to an Impressive Start to the Season

On Monday, November 25, the Red Lake County Central Mustangs played Goodridge Grygla in Goodridge. It was a close and intense game between the Mustangs and the Chargers. But the Mustangs got a slight lead at the end and won the game 64 to 60. Aubrey Halverson got 15 points and 3 offensive rebounds. Alexa Chervestad got 10 points and 2 defensive rebounds. McKaelyn Frizzle got 24 points and 6 defensive rebounds. Quin Graves got 9 points, 7 defensive rebounds, and 3 assists. Emma Hendrickson got 3 assists.

On Tuesday, December 3rd, the Red Lake County Central Mustangs hosted the Bagley Flyers. In the first half of the game, RLCC was ahead 39 to 21. In the second half of the game, the Mustangs scored 40

points to the Flyers' 34, ending the game with a final score of 79 to 55

On Friday, December 6, the Red Lake County Central Mustangs Traveled to Clearbrook to play the Clearbrook Gonvick Bears. It was a close and enjoyable game, but the Mustangs pulled a lead and won 58 to 45. The Mustangs scored 26 points in the paint and had 23 steals.

The Red Lake County Central Mustangs traveled to Stephen Argyle on Monday, December 9. The first half was very close, but the Mustangs' shots didn't fall as well as the Storms' during the second half. Argyle pulled a lead towards the end of the game, and the Mustangs fell short, losing 48 to 56.

North-South All Star Game

North and South Kickers Make Two All-Star Game Record Field Goals As South Defeats North 24-10 in 51st Annual Minnesota High School Football All-Star Football Game (Game story by Dave Giles, Minnesota All-Star Football Game Historian)

After trailing 10-7 at the half, the South outscored the North 17-0 in the second half to win the 51st Annual Minnesota High School All-Star Football Game 24-10 at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

It was a record setting day for North place kicker Daniel Jackson (Alexandria) and South place kicker Luke Ryerse (East Ridge). Both kickers made All-Star Game record field goals - Jackson hitting a game record 54-yard field goal with 11:53 remaining in the second quarter and Ryerse setting a new game record with a 57-yard field goal as time expired in the fourth quarter. The previous record was 52 yards, set in 2014 by Reid Taubenheim of Farmington. Note: both Jackson and Ryerse will play football at the University of Minnesota. Congratulations to both Daniel Jackson and Luke Ryerse for their memorable performances in this All-Star game.

In the first quarter, a 26-yard punt return by Bo Bokman (Lakeville South) gave the South a short field at the North 37-yard line. Led by quarterback Ganden Gosch (Mankato East), the South drove 37 yards in seven plays with Gosch scoring on a 1-yard quarterback sneak. Luke Ryerse (East Ridge) added the first of his three PATs to give the South a 7-0 lead.

After Daniel Jackson's record setting 54-yard field goal early in the second quarter,

the North's next drive was 49 yards in 4 plays, with Morris Area/Chokio-Alberta quarterback Drew Huebner throwing a 29-yard touchdown pass Seth Staloch (Osakis) with 6:48 remaining. Jackson added the PAT for a 10-7 North lead. Daniel Jackson attempted a 62-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter, but it was not good.

In the third quarter, the North went three and out on their first possession. The South took over at their 25 and promptly drove 75 yards for another score. The touchdown was a 35-yard pass from Ganden Gosch to South Offensive MVP Nolan Ginskey (WR Owatonna). Green fertilizer grant announced at Green Ammonia Summit

MORRIS, Minn. – Minnesota Agriculture Commissioner Thom Petersen announced the launch of the state's Green Fertilizer Grant Program at the Green Ammonia Summit held Dec. 10 in Morris.

"MFU was thrilled to host the Agriculture Commissioner for this announcement and is optimistic about the future of green ammonia and its potential to support family farmers and rural communities," said Minnesota Farmers Union (MFU) President Gary Wertish. "The Green Ammonia Summit was an incredible opportunity to come together, discuss what's happening around green ammonia and chart a course for future success."

The Green Ammonia Summit brought together leaders from agriculture, energy, government and business at the University of Minnesota Morris to discuss the role of green ammonia in decarbonizing industries, promoting rural development and advancing sustainable agriculture. More than 115 people participated in the summit, underscoring the growing interest in green ammonia, which is produced using renewable energy sources. Green ammonia significantly reduces the greenhouse gas emissions associated with nitrogen fertilizer use.

Nitrogen fertilizer derived from fossil fuel accounts for up to 2 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions and contributes up to 35 percent of the carbon footprint of corn. The fertilizer industry is also heavily concentrated, with just four companies controlling over three quarters of the market. Regionally produced green ammonia offers the possibility of decarbonizing the agricultural sector while creating more competitive markets for farm inputs.

"Minnesotans collectively spend half a billion to a billion dollars a year on nitrogen fertil-

izer. So if we can capture those dollars and keep them in our rural communities, that makes a huge economic impact," said Mike Reese, Director of Operations and the Renewable Hydrogen and Ammonia Research Lead at the University of Minnesota West Central Research and Outreach Center in Morris. "Being able to support the young people for jobs and economic opportunities, support young people going into farming. I think of my nine-year-old son, and I think this is something I want to do for him."

Former North Dakota Sen. Heidi Heitkamp, keynote speaker at the summit's evening reception, highlighted how rural communities stand to benefit from local green ammonia production through job creation and enhanced economic resilience.

Cooperatives were identified as a key mechanism to ensure the economic benefits of fertilizer production support rural economies.

"If we are able to employ this new technology in a more democratic or diffuse economic system, like through cooperatives, it will create greater economic vitality in greater Minnesota," said Sen. Aric Putnam, DFL-St. Cloud, chair of the Senate Agriculture, Broadband and Rural Development Committee, who authored the bill creating Minnesota's Green Fertilizer Grant Program in 2023. "And with this economic vitality comes rejuvenation, not just for downtowns, but those communities as a whole."

"If we can produce fertilizer here at home, it's a win-win for the farmer, the economy, and all the people of Minnesota," said Rep. Paul Anderson, R-Starbuck, incoming co-chair of the Minnesota House Agriculture Finance and Policy Committee. Anderson co-authored the Green Fertilizer bill in the House.

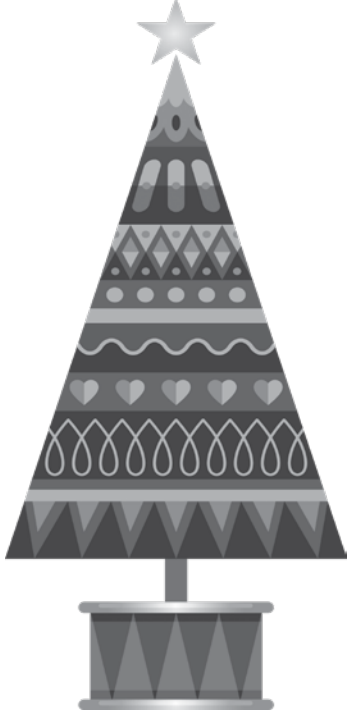

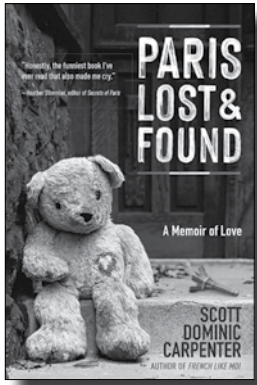

Memoir redefines the City of Light

"We'll always have Paris," Rick tells Ilsa in the classic film Casablanca in which Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman set for the ages Paris as a backdrop for romance. Some even consider the film as ginning up public support for the Allied invasion of North Africa in World War II.

While the impact of that classic film will likely never die, Paris as a mecca for lovers is redefined in the moving memoir Paris Lost and Found by Scott Dominic Carpenter, professor of

French literature and creative writing at Carleton College in Northfield, Minn. Carpenter recounts the place Paris had in his and his late wife Anne's hearts, how that all began to change as Anne fell victim to Alzheimer's, the virtual shutdown of Paris during the COVID pandemic and finally Carpenter's rediscovery of Paris through the eyes of another partner.

As a professor of French literature at Carleton, Carpenter was probably better able to negotiate the cultural intricacies

of Paris than most Americans. However, that did little to heal the pain he felt as Anne fell victim to her disease.

Despite that, Carpenter manages to use humor throughout the book like a bandage over the pain of loss and sorrow. As he negotiated through a labyrinth of French idiosyncrasies, we can begin to understand just how frustrating life was as he found light at the end of the tunnel in, of all places, the City of Light.

That light came when he met Bonnie, a woman whose background and tastes matched his own.

"Turned out, Bonnie had lost a mate, too. We compared notes and generally agreed that it sucks."

In the end, it was their mutual ability to see Paris

as it was that made them a perfect match.

"That's what I'd been doing for Paris over the years – catching it with its makeup off. And now Bonnie was willing to do the same for me. Indeed, she embraced this new responsibility with gusto."

Carpenter's memoir can offer lessons for us all. Just as we may associate a certain place with a certain person, that can all change when that person is gone. However, if we are able to rediscover that same place through another's eyes, life can take on new meaning.

Carpenter's memoir is entertaining and moving, but without the meaningless romantic platitudes foisted upon us by travel agencies and the tourism industry. We see Paris as both gritty and beautiful.

And people can be the same.

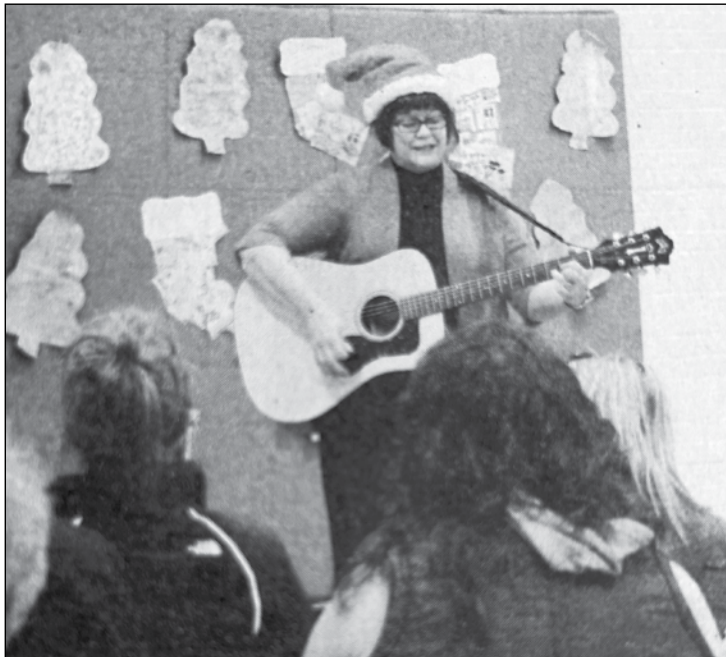
