## Faith, Food and Family night returns next week

Faith, Food and Family (FFF) night began last year in Grygla and was very successful. It's a program that will be happening every Wednesday night at Grace Lutheran Church in Grygla.

Faith, Food and Family night is an after-school program that is open to all students Kindergarten and older, along with their families. It's open to anyone, not just members of Grace Lutheran Church.

FFF began after the church received a grant that helped fund the meal portion every week. Vicar Marilyn Grafstrom said the original idea came together as a trial run to combine Sunday School on a weekday, holding a special time for families and making meals for them. Vicar Marilyn says, "This vision came out of a dream story we wrote as part of practicing resurrection based on an assessment that included interviews in the community and with church members." FFF night is held every Wednesday and replaces Sunday School; it's been very popular with kids and families.

As mentioned, FFF is held after school every Wednesday. Kids K-6, along with their parents, can attend. Usually, the group does music right away, led by Vicar Marilyn, then they split up into age groups for that week's Bible lesson. Kids can then have some free time to play games, do puzzles, read books, or do homework with their peers. Supper is served from 5-5:30 p.m.

There were a variety of volunteers who helped make last year's event such a success which included older high school students who came in and spent time with the younger kids and helped them; those students also earned NHS credit and volunteer hours. There were also many parents, grandparents and community volunteers who all joined together to share in the FFF vision.

Faith, Food and Family night kicks off for the year again next Wednesday night, October 4. These gatherings will happen every Wednesday except when there is no school on a Thursday or Friday, or when school is closed due to weather. 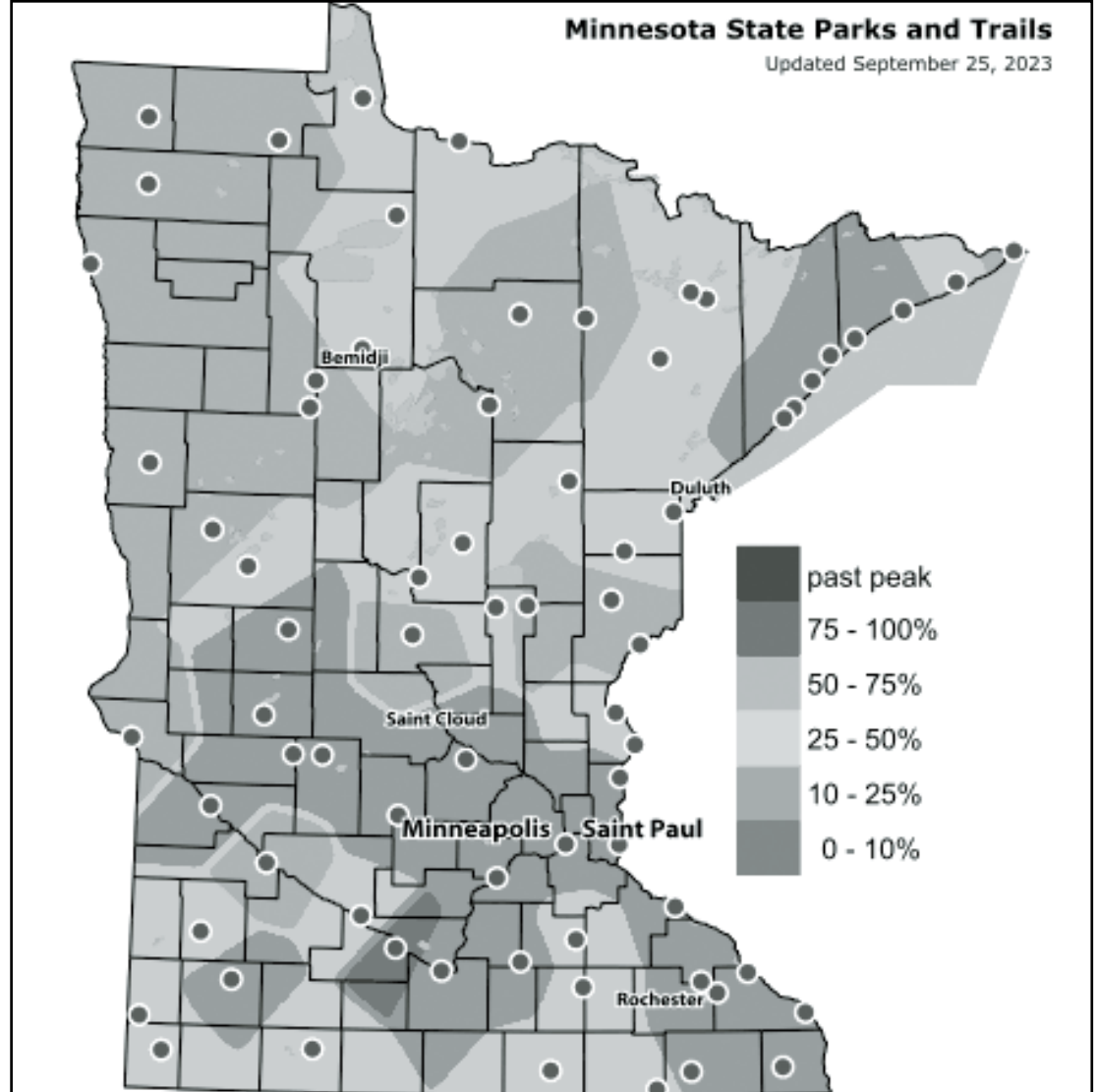

Sisu and Löyly launched its floating sauna on Grand Marais



Harbor in September 2023.

In fall of 2023, the floating sauna will move to a dock on Devil Track Lake, just off the Gunflint Trail outside of Grand Marais.

One of the benefits of the floating spa is the built-in cold plunge. Or if you prefer a more gradual cool down, you can certainly just enjoy the views from the deck.

You're certain to feel refreshed and relaxed after a steam in Sisu and Löyly's floating sauna. The Nordic sauna also maintains a fantastic Facebook presence, so be sure to check it out for stunning pictures of the sauna and the Grand Marais area. ## Marshall County ECI celebrates Dolly Parton's Imagination Library 200 Millionth Book Milestone

The Imagination Library legacy – is celebrating 200 million books gifted globally since inception in 1995. The early childhood book-gifting program mails a high-quality, free book each month to children from birth to age five. Marshall County Early Childhood Initiative is excited to celebrate with every child/family enrolled locally. Each year since 2004, this local affiliate donates over 5,000 books to the homes of children throughout Marshall County.

To celebrate this global 200 million book milestone, seven enchanting Dolly bookmarks will be randomly hidden inside Imagination Library books gifted during International Literacy Month (September) to children/families currently enrolled in the program. (Children must be enrolled by July 31, 2023, to receive Imagination Library books in September.) It's a small chance but there could be a bookmark right here in Marshall County. If so, be sure to check out your books and contact the DP Imagination Library with the ad-

dress at the end of this article.

Seven random children/families in five countries who find the Dolly bookmarks in their Imagination Library books will receive, if they choose, a video chat with Dolly, a personalized signed letter from Dolly, an autographed photo from Dolly, and four Dollywood Theme Park tickets. The Dollywood Foundation will also donate \$2000 on behalf of the child to their Local Imagination Library Partner in their community as a thank you to who Dolly calls the true heroes of her program.

Inspired by her father's inability to read and write, Dolly started the Imagination Library in 1995 to serve the children of her hometown in Sevier County, Tennessee. Today, her program spans five countries and gifts over 2.4 million free, high-quality, age-appropriate books each month to children around the world. There is never a charge to families who participate in the program, and it is open to all children under the age of five in geographic areas with operating programs.

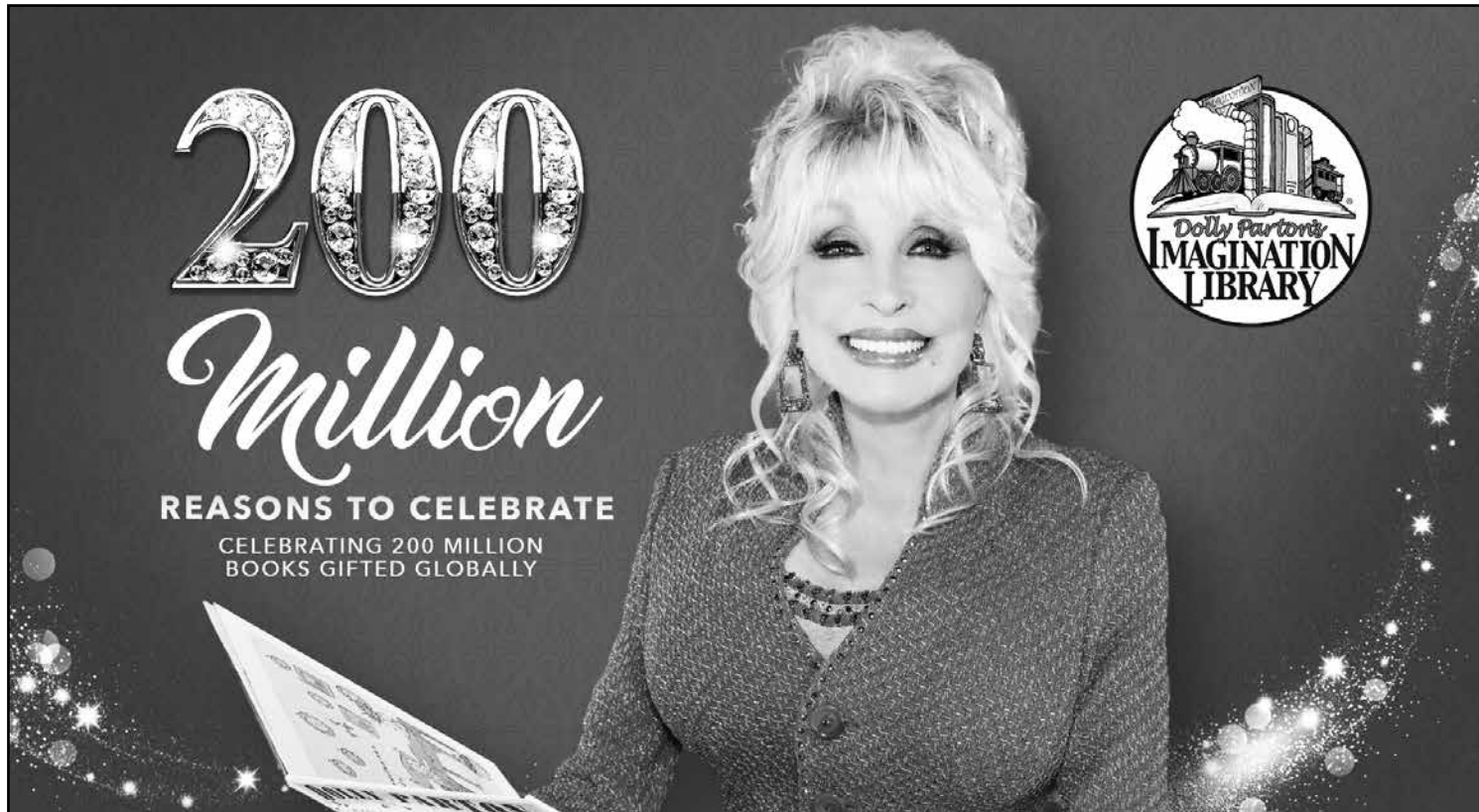
"I know there are children in communities around the world with big dreams and the seeds of these dreams are often found in books," said Dolly. "It's been one of my greatest gifts in life to help instill a love of reading through my Imagination Library. Reaching 200 million books worldwide is a major milestone that I'm so very proud of, and I want to thank all of our local program partners, funders and supporters from the bottom of my heart. But we're just getting warmed up, we have so much more to do! Together, we can inspire even more children to dream more, learn more, care more and be more."

### Mexican Street Corn Chicken

This Mexican Street Corn Chicken is a FAVORITE chicken breast dinner. With tender chicken smothered in a creamy corn mixture, it has all the flavors of Mexican Elote, but made with minimal time and effort.

- Can be prepped and in the oven in as little as 10 minutes

- Bakes hands off
- Both the protein and a side in just one casserole dish

As for the Queso Fresco—this can be found usually in the cheese section of the grocery store, or sometimes in the specialty Mexican section if they have one in the refrigerated area. It is a crumbly, mild white cheese that perfectly complements the dish.

2 lbs boneless, skinless chicken breast (4-6 thin chicken breasts)

3 cups sweet corn (2 cans, drained)

1/4 cup mayonnaise

1/4 cup sour cream

1/2 tbsp lime juice

1 1/2 tsp chili powder

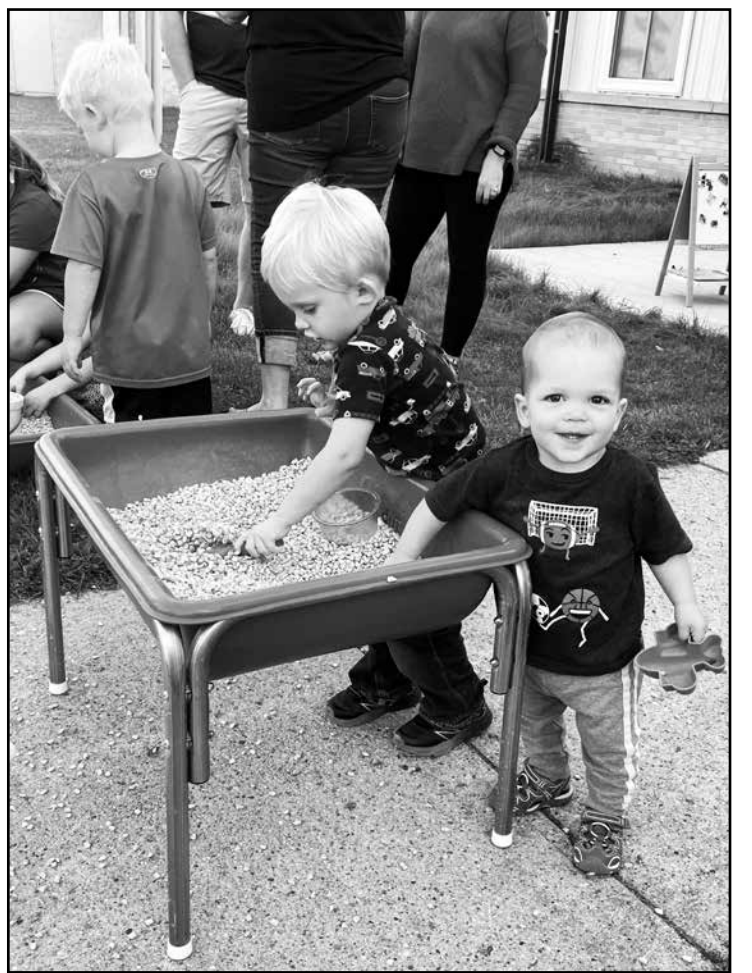
1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp garlic powder

1/4 tsp cayenne pepper (optional)

Topping  
1/4 cup queso fresco, crumbled

1/4 cup cilantro, chopped  
In a large bowl, combine the sweet corn, mayonnaise, sour cream, lime juice, and chili powder and mix to combine. In a casserole dish, lay the thin chicken breasts flat in the dish. Then season with salt, garlic powder and cayenne pepper. Spread the corn mixture evenly over the top of the chicken. Bake at 350°F, uncovered, for 30-40 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through (165°F internal temp). Then remove from the oven and garnish the top with crumbled queso fresco and chopped cilantro.
